Later this month we'll celebrate Thanksgiving. But I'm celebrating already and for good reason. I cannot put into words how grateful I am for the way this congregation has responded to a simple but sincere apology.

When we were contacted this year by the person who had broken into our church and stolen expensive equipment I was both impressed and cautious. Clifton wanted to apologize to us for his actions 12 years before. After meeting with him and hearing his story it was decided he would meet with the session to make amends.

His only request has been to apologize and say that after 11+ years in prison he wanted to tell us that he knew what he did was wrong.

He has served his sentence. He has returned to society and is trying to move forward the best he can in order to stay out of trouble and risk being sent back. He is well aware of the rough road ahead of him and yet one of his first requests was to tell this church that he was sorry. The session was both impressed and loving in response. After listening to Clifton they were unanimous in forgiving him. It was a true moment of grace and healing.

But then, on that following Sunday, you were presented with his story and his apology. And during the sermon time, when I presented you a poster sized card to so sign for him, everyone in the church came forward to sign it. The feeling of God's Spirit was palpable. ANYONE present could have said "sorry, he doesn't deserve it" or put some condition on his forgiveness. But NO ONE did. You didn't just hear about forgiveness in a sermon, you participated in it as the body of Christ. You didn't just sign some note about God's forgiveness, YOU FORGAVE!!! No words can fully express the holiness of that moment.


When I gave the card to Clifton he couldn't hold back his tears, as he had no idea that this was coming. He had been given a simple yet powerful gift. I saw it in his eyes as he read your comments. Not just 'signed names' but the personal 'comments of encouragement' which many of you wrote. I know pride can be a sin but I couldn't help myself that day. I saw what your loving kindness meant to another sinner. God alone knows what is in store for Clifton. But because of your action, Clifton knows that there is mercy and grace for him. Please continue to pray for this young man. He could sure use it.

I leave you with one thought. When it comes to God's love, this church knows it and shows it. Thanks be to God.
